COACH RAFFIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND Criteria and Advisory Selection Committee

1. **SCHOLARSHIP GRANT AWARDS:** All awards from the **Coach Raffin Scholarship Fund** shall be awarded as the **Coach Raffin Scholarship of the Community Foundation of Greater Flint**. The award may be used for tuition, books, fees and housing* related to higher education.
2. **PROJECTED NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND AMOUNTS:** *The Community Foundation's Gift Acceptance Policy limits two scholarship grant awards per \$50,000.00 in fund assets. As the Fund assets grow the Advisory Selection Committee may recommend to the Board of Trustees an increase in the number of awards and amount of awards.*
There shall be one recipient recommended per year, a non-renewable award with the goal of eventually awarding one \$5,000.00 scholarship each year.
3. **RECOMMENDED CRITERIA OF ELIGIBILITY:** *Criteria for scholarship awards must further a charitable purpose, maintain objective and non-discriminatory standards and provide for an adequate grantee pool. For a complete description refer to the Community Foundation's Policies and Procedures for Scholarship Administration. Criteria must be approved by the Foundation Board of Trustees prior to making first scholarship awards and thereafter annually.*

Recommended Criteria:

- a. Student must be a graduating senior of Holly High School who was a member of the cross-country team or track and field team.
 - b. Student must have participated in Holly High School cross-country or track and field during any one year in high school.
 - c. Student must have been accepted to a college, university or technical school.
 - d. Recipient will embody values instilled by Coach Raffin through the demonstration of hard work, perseverance and a positive mental attitude. This may be demonstrated through one of more letters of recommendation provided by the applicant as well as the observations and experience of the advisory selection committee.
 - e. Student must submit an application.
 - f. Student must have met the Holly High School academic requirement for participation in athletics.
4. **RECOMMENDED SCHOLARSHIP ADVISORY SELECTION COMMITTEE:** *For a complete guide to scholarship advisory committee composition refer to the Community Foundation's Policies and Procedures for Scholarship Administration. All scholarship advisory committee members must be approved by the Foundation's Board of Trustees prior to making first scholarship awards and thereafter annually. Scholarship Advisory Committee considerations: Donor (person for whom the fund is named) may participate on selection committee; Donor or the donor's designees (related parties such as family members, attorney, financial advisor) may not chair committee or in any way control the selection process or constitute a majority of the selection committee members; Board of Trustees ultimately control composition of committee and approval of all scholarship grant awards.*

Recommended Advisory Selection Committee:

- a. Coach Raffin during his lifetime and family designee thereafter
 - b. Girls Cross Country Coach
 - c. Boys Cross Country Coach
 - d. Girls Track and Field Coach
 - e. Boys Track and Field Coach
 - f. Holly Schools Athletic Director, chair
 - g. Holly High School Assistant Principal
 - h. Alternate (Holly high school faculty or counselor)
5. **ADMINISTRATION:** The Foundation will publicize the availability of this scholarship in its printed materials and on its website, and will provide technical assistance and administrative oversight of the selection committee and scholarship award process.
